Be 100% Sure.




Wash your palms.

The 2020 Premier's Reading Challenge

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is now open, and we are excited to be participating once again. This is a program that encourages students to read a set number of quality fiction and non-fiction books from a selected list nominated by the premier's office.

It is not a competition, but a personal challenge open for all children in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development.

Students in **Kindergarten to Year 2** need to experience **30 books**, 25 of these books need to come from the K-2 PRC booklists, 5 books can be free choice. K-2 students will read books at school during their Library or class time.

Students in **Years 3-6** are challenged to read **20 books**, 15 of these books must be on the PRC booklists and 5 books can be their own free choice. Students are to read their books independently and are encouraged to read as many different titles as they can.

A certificate from the PRC team will be awarded on successful completion of the challenge. This will be awarded in Term 4.

The challenge runs from Monday 2nd March to Friday 28th August.
